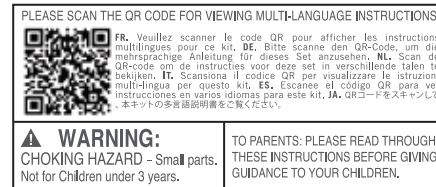

## Creepy Crawly Digging Kit



### A. SAFETY MESSAGES

1. Please read through these instructions before you start.
2. Adult assistance and supervision are required.
3. Excess plaster dust may irritate the eyes, nose and throat. Handle with care. Adult supervision is required. Do not place the material in the mouth or apply it to the body. Avoid contact with the eyes and inhalation of dust. In case of eyes contact, flush with water and consult your physician if discomfort persists. During the digging process, periodically remove the dust with the brush. Do not attempt to blow the dust off. Use a water spray bottle to dampen the dust to make removing it from the work surface easier. The wet plaster may stain so wear an apron or old clothes. A pair of protective goggles or a face mask is recommended for further protection while digging.
4. This kit is intended for children aged over 5.
5. This kit and its finished product contain small parts which may cause choking if misused. Keep away from children under 3 years old.

### B. REMARKS

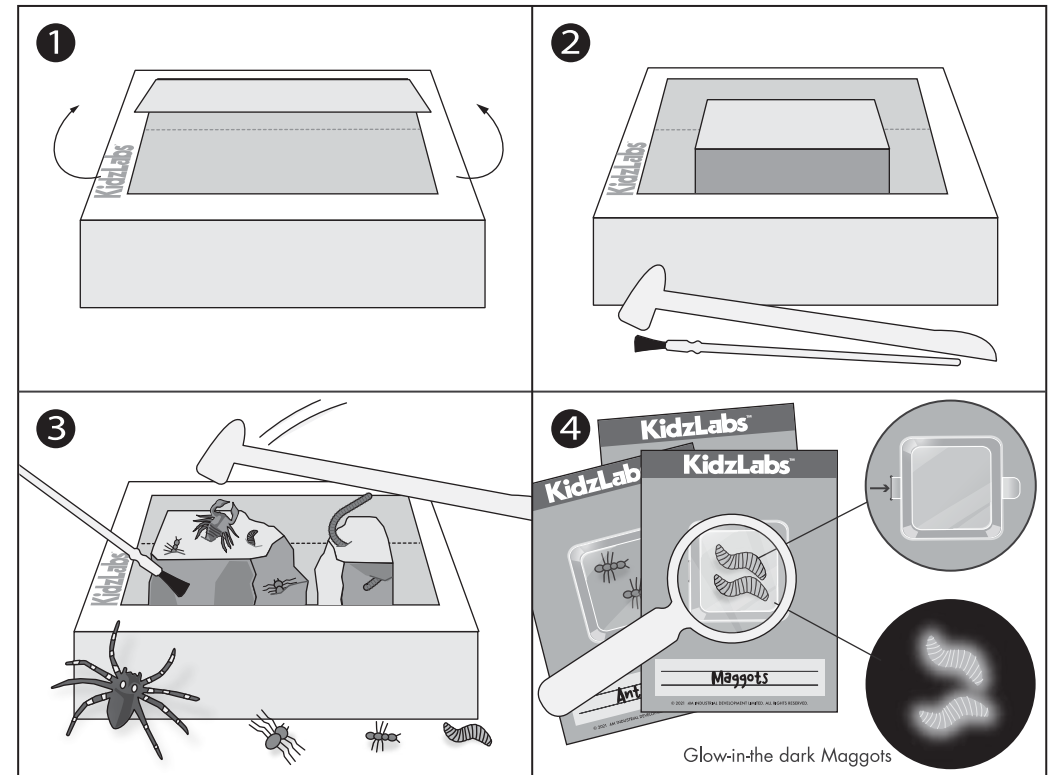
1. Always work on a solid, level work surface. Cover the surface with newspaper to protect it and to make cleaning up easier.
  2. Wear an apron or old clothes as plaster can stain clothing. Use laundry detergent on stained clothing and wash separately.
  3. Dispose of the excess plaster into the trash. Do not put the plaster powder down a sink or bathtub drain as this may clog the pipes.
- Note: The digging process has to be done with patience. The whole process may take a few hours or days to complete. However, if you would like to quicken the digging process, spray water onto the plaster or submerge the whole block into a sink of water for a minute before digging. This will soften the plaster. Be aware that the wet plaster may stain clothes.

### C. CONTENTS

Plaster block with creepy crawlies (spider, scorpion, earthworm, ants, mini spiders, glow-in-the-dark maggots), digging tool, brush, large and small specimen cards, blister covers, magnifier and detailed instructions.

### D. INSTRUCTIONS

1. Find the perforated lines on the back of the product's box and push out the cutout. This will be your tray for the digging process.
2. Place the plaster block in the middle of the tray. This will help to keep your work area clean while your unearth the bugs.
3. Dig away the plaster with the hammer side of the tool. When the plaster is loosened, scrape the pieces away with the flat side of the tool. When a bug begins to emerge, dig with care! Gently scrape and cut off the plaster surrounding the bugs with the rough blade at the end of the tool's handle. Use the brush to dust off the remaining plaster from the bugs. Any remaining dust can be wiped off with a damp cloth. Once all the bugs have been found, mount the bugs on the specimen cards.
4. There are spider, scorpion, earthworm, ants, mini spiders, glow-in-the-dark maggots buried inside the plaster block. Take out the specimen cards and blister covers. Write the name of the bug in the information square. After you have filled in the information, slide the blister cover containing the bug into the specimen card. For glow-in-the-dark Maggots, put them in the light for a few minutes and they will glow when you take them into the dark.



### E. FUN FACTS

- All spiders produce silk that they use to make webs or snares to catch prey, or to spin egg cases.
- A typical spider's web needs 20 metres of silk.
- Most spiders have eight eyes, but some have only six, and some have fewer.
- Scorpions are arachnids, like spiders.
- A scorpion stings its prey with the poisonous tip of its tail, called its telson.
- Different species of scorpions have different types of poison that kills the animals they prey on.
- Some species of scorpions carry poison strong enough to kill a person.
- There are around 6,000 different species of earthworms.
- The largest species of earthworm grow up to 3 metres long!
- Ants are super strong for their size – an ant can lift about fifty times its own bodyweight.
- The bullet ant, which lives in jungles, is said to have the most painful bite of any insect - like being hit by a bullet!
- Ants use chemical signals called pheromones to send messages to other ants.
- A maggot is the larva of a fly. It eats non stop for a few days before turning into a pupa, which transforms into an adult fly.
